This checklist is designed to help educators implement Imagine Language & Literacy for summer school.

Summer School Goals

- □ First, log in to <u>Imagine Language & Literacy</u> using your educator credentials to make sure you can access the platform. Contact your administrator if you need assistance.
- □ Identify your summer school usage goals. How much time will students spend on the program each day or week? (Imagine Learning recommends 15-20 minute sessions.)
- Determine when students will use Imagine Language & Literacy during summer school:
 - □ Station rotations □ Independent practice time □ At home

Summer School Set-Up

- □ Ensure that students have accounts and that summer school classes have been created.
 - If your district/school automatically pulls classes from your Student Information System (SIS), check that your groups are correct.
 - If you are responsible for creating classes, use the "Manage Groups" button on the right side of your teacher dashboard to create a class.
- □ Enable first-language audio support for students who need it, in the "Manage Students" section of your teacher dashboard.

Key Summer School Data

□ To monitor student data, click into each report in your <u>teacher dashboard</u> dropdown menu.

- Usage: review weekly to monitor fidelity of usage and take needed action
- Progress: view lesson details, print achievement certificates, and track mastery of specific skills
- Portfolio: monitor oral reading fluency and writing growth through student work samples

Summer School Best Practices

- □ Use <u>session trackers</u> to help students set goals and keep track of their usage.
- □ Send home <u>family letters</u> to explain what Imagine Language & Literacy is, how students can use it at home, and how families can support their student's literacy development.
- Celebrate students' summer school growth with <u>achievement certificates</u>.
- □ In addition to students working independently in Imagine Language & Literacy, use the <u>Activity Explorer</u> and printable <u>Teacher Resources</u> in whole-group, small-group, and 1:1 summer school instruction.
- Create <u>Playlists</u> to target specific summer school skills.
